Kentucky High School State Wrestling Championship Preview

Well at least we aren't faced with a bunch of snow and a delayed tournament...

Remember a year ago and the complete chaos of the weather and delaying the event until MARCH? What a mess. Instead this year we are looking at sunny and 60. Only in Kentucky. Hopefully the up and down weather doesn't aggravate any allergies worse than they already are before the kids get to the horse park. Speaking of worse, the injuries and missing wrestlers keep mounting. The regional tournament took a toll on some of our top ranked kids with a couple major injuries. A short list of the kids unable to compete due to injury or just unwilling to wrestle includes top ranked Tylan Tucker, highly ranked kids such as Clayton Hanson, Derek Wiley, Derrick Smallwood, state champ Alex McIntosh, 2x state champ Johnny Meiman, and 2x state champ Tyler Frankrone to name a few. That is a lot of firepower to be missing from our state tournament. Keep those injured in your thoughts and prayers and hope for the best for the kids who are dealing with other struggles in their life.

I can't fail to mention a huge boost to the Kentucky wrestling community recently. A huge boost to the success of many of the kids mentioned in this report (as well as many top middle school wrestlers) can be directly related back to the training and top coaching they are receiving at their club teams. Clubs such as ETC, No-Ox, Carr Wrestling, and Knable Wrestling are providing a great service to kids around the state as they seek out opportunities to improve and reach their goals. Kudos to those coaches and programs.

These are **predicted finishes** based on my final rankings. The early round matchups are based on rankings, not predicted finish. As usual, I'm sure I missed my fair share of results, so they are not perfect. They also do not reflect any scratches that have come in the last day or so (I haven't seen any posted by KHSAA) beyond the major injuries that I was notified about. And even **IF** they were perfect rankings, upsets always happen on the big stage. Dutch and I have put in hours and hours on this report. Thanks to Stacy for not meeting me at the door with a gun over the last few very late nights and Amber for actually letting me back in the house at 2 am night after night. It is impossible to pull all of this information together alone. And Dutch has been a huge part of getting this great report out.

A couple interesting items we could see this weekend:

- 1) REPEAT: Is Saul able to continue the family tradition (an Ervin has won a state title since like 2006)? He has been the guy to beat here all season and appears to be a heavy favorite to win title #2.
- 2) REPEAT: Can anyone stop Sheffer from going 4-for-4 (and 8-for-8 overall)? Another Union County heavy favorite.
- 3) REPEAT: Who will win 138? The deepest weight class in the tournament from 1-10 with multiple state champs and finalists should have the crowd's attention from the opening round.
- 4) REPEAT with a slight variation: Who will step up to win a wide open 195 weight class with the injury to Tyler Frankrone?
- 5) Can anyone hang with Union County? I believe they were the best dual team in the state (winning small school) and this weekend I see it as a large margin between them and second place, especially with Trinity down a big gun.
- 6) The annual finals drama: How late will the final round go with the new format? Will the upper weights wrestle Saturday night or Sunday morning?

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Tom Ketchen-Carter – kid wrestles hard and just like Zeke expects to win

Team title race implications: There are a number of kids that could help push their team ABOVE the pack by making the podium. Tom KC has the best draw to make a major impact, but Lenhart and Ballinger could make a difference. Wheeler, Yost, and Klein are critical to their team having a shot at a trophy. If Escalera steps it up, Union County could lock up the title early.

106 is loaded with state placers from last year. 4 of the top 8 placers from this weight will be returning for another shot at the title. There has been a lot of talk about Escalera making a run. How will the talented 7th grader match up with some of the larger contenders? Wallace seems to be on a mission this year coming in with a 51-0 record. Wheeler has been at the top majority of the year. Will he be able to run through the gauntlet of Miller, Roth, Yost/Bender to win his first state title? There will be some fireworks for sure at the 106 weight class. As TO says "get your popcorn ready".

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Michael Mattox - the kid just finds a way to make the podium every year

Team title race implications: Again it is teams in the 3-8 pack battling it out. Could a Yenter-Lampe final determine the Campbell-Fern Creek team finish? St. Xavier guys tend to pick it up this time of year; can Kraeszig pull off a couple mild upsets and push his team into a trophy spot? North Oldham is solid from top to bottom, but they need a podium finish from Johnson to stay ahead of the chasing teams.

With injury to Tylan Tucker the layout of this bracket has changed dramatically. Tucker was a heavy favorite to win this bracket. That puts Yenter at the top and favorite to win his first title after last year's runner up performance. Miller and Mattox are returning state placers looking to improve on last years finish. We have a few young guns making their first attempt at a high school state title. Grant-Hall and Lutes met in the middle school state finals this year. Grant-Hall pulled off a late take down to get the win over Lutes that day. Can they hang with the high school competition? We say yes they can.

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Tyler Storck "The Dork" – nice draw that sets him up to place higher than his current ranking

Team title race implications: Not only do you have one of the deepest individual weights here, but virtually all of the predicted placers are from top 12 teams. The order of finish will play a role in how the team race unfolds. The timing of some of these huge matchups and how the kids recover from tough losses will be critical to scoring the expected team points from these big guns from Campbell County, St. Xavier, North Oldham, and Henry Clay.

Saul is looking to continue the family tradition of titles. Standing in his way is a loaded field of 120 pound wrestlers. Can he navigate through the loaded half of the bracket? This includes Wells and former state champ Hurst. The lower half of the bracket has Moore looking to win his first state title. He will have to get past a tough Cook, Dodd, and Ochsenbein to get his rematch with Saul. The quarters on the top half of the bracket will be matches you will not want to miss. Once again what will it take to get the state to seed the bracket? Maybe with the additional parking funds we could hire someone to seed the tournament. Just a thought.

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: The FIELD – much less proven group of wrestlers here opens up spots on the podium to a wide range of kids

Team title race implications: More typical team impacts here with Sheffer likely rolling through to the finals. Can McClintic make a push for a high placement and get Oldham County within striking distance of Union? And where will Lillie finish? He surprised most of us last year; does he have any magic left this go around to push Campbell near the top?

Bryce Sheffer is looking for number 3. Who will stand in his way? Looking at the bracket it looks like Sheffer will pick up some bonus on the way to the finals. Looking at the other side of the bracket, we believe it will come down to Castellano and Cambron. Castellano has been on a mission this year. Our opinion is that he is the most improved wrestler in the state. Cambron is a returning state placer looking to improve on last years placement. Let's not forget about the young up and coming McClintic (also known as Squid).

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Kaden Darbro – doesn't have the best early draw, but I believe his consolation draws set up nice for him to make a run.

Team title race implications: Similar to Zeke at 106, Micah can score some icing points for Union County here. He is young, but very talented. As mentioned above, Darbro is set to give St. Xavier a major boost like we have seen from so many X kids over the years. Barrett could be an X-factor for Campbell County as he wrestled very tough at the regional and comes in with a lot of momentum. Trinity is heavily dependent on their big guns, so Duncan bonus points will drive them up the leader board.

Once again Duncan is the favorite at 132. Standing in his way is some very talented/seasoned state placers. Brown was on a roll last year and has a few injury issues this year. If he is 100%, he could be in the state finals for the 2nd year in a row. Roberts and Monroe both placed last year and might have other plans for the state finals. Lets don't for get about the young man Ervin looking to following in big brothers footsteps. Will he pull off some magic?

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Jacob Henley – kid isn't flashy, but just solid. And in a deep, tough bracket it will take some solid wrestling to navigate through this minefield.

Team title race implications: Another weight where the Camels have an X-factor. Spahr pulled off the upset at region and showed he has the potential to score big this weekend, but this weight is deep and it won't be easy. North Oldham needs Alemi to put up solid points here; could be a dangerous spot for them. This could also be a spot where Union County takes a hit. We haven't seen Oxford against many of these kids in this field, so where he finishes will be somewhat a surprise to all of us.

138 here we go again. 2 years in a row, arguably the toughest bracket in the state. Lets start at the top. Vasquez looking for his 3rd finals appearance in a row at 138. We also have returning champion "Birdman" Erdman and state finalist "The big announcement" Binder. Will they be able to knock off the proven champion of this weight? With the regional final upset of Spahr over Erdman, this sets up a big match Friday night of Erdman and Johnson.

After coming up a little short last season mostly due to a great team effort from Fern Creek, Union County is coming back to the horse park this year on a mission. I don't want to go out on a limb and say they can't be beat, but I truly believe it is theirs to lose. Oldham County has a solid hold on the runner-up spot bringing their team of a generation. The middle of that lineup is as strong as anyone in the state and they are showing some extra strength in the upper weights as well. While I don't see them catching Union County, I also don't think the pack can catch the Colonels. Now to the pack. I see the next 5 teams (North Oldham, Campbell County, Trinity, Woodford County, St. Xavier) within 10 points of each other and Fern Creek not far behind them. All of those teams have 2-3 hammers that will put up big points so it will come down to the role players pulling out those big consolation wins that add up to a team trophy. Really hate to see injuries to Tucker and Frankrone; horrible for the kids who have worked so hard for years, but also has a huge impact on team points as those boys would likely put up a ton of bonus points on their way to the finals and likely titles. Since I am somewhat obsessed with correlating kids/teams middle school performance to the high school level, this was set up to be the first of two championship runs for Campbell County. They put up over 170 points 4 years ago at middle school state with 4 champs and 5 finalists. While one is no longer in purple and gold (Moore), the other 4 (Yenter, Wells, Spahr, Graziani) are poised to put the team in position for a high finish.
