Kentucky High School State Wrestling Championship Preview

Well, the end of another season. The competition level around the state continues to rise, but this is a very tough senior class that will take home a lot of the hardware this weekend. But we will see a lot of very good middle schoolers and underclassmen battling for spots on the podium as well. We are having more and more national level success at the high school, middle school, and youth levels. I expect this event to get better and better as the competition increases.

These are predicted finishes based on my final rankings. As usual, I'm sure I missed my fair share of results, so they are not perfect. They also do not reflect any scratches that have come in the last day or so. And even IF they were perfect rankings, upsets always happen on the big stage.

A couple interesting items we could see this weekend:

- 1) Our first ever 5-time state champion in Brock Ervin
- 2) 2 sets of brothers winning titles (Hernandez @ 106/113 and Lampe @ 152/160)
- 3) Austin Myers finish 3 years undefeated through his junior season
- 4) Can Bryce Sheffer pull a John Fahy type performance and follow up his 4 KSWA MS state titles with a KHSAA HS title as a freshman?

It will be interesting to see if the young guns (Wells, Ervin, Cook) can step up under the bright lights and knock off the older top 3 (Hernandez, Hurst, Burroughs). With their prior KHSAA placement experience, Hernandez and Burroughs should hold up to the pressure. But Wells and Ervin have wrestled plenty of big matches in their young careers as well. The best early match should be Hernandez-Ervin in the quarters.

This will be a weight that will impact the team race with 5 kids from the top teams with potential to finish on the podium. Upsets will be huge. Ervin and Cook have the toughest road to a medal out of these guys.

Hearing rumblings that Burroughs is out this weekend. If so, I truly hate to hear that. Jake is a great, great kid. And everyone know Joe B. is one of the best coaches and men you will ever meet. Jake, I hope to see you on the mat tomorrow. If not, I'm sure all these years of wrestling has taught you well to keep battling.

This was one of the most up and down weights this season as returning state champ Vega took a few losses, including some due to injury, and some young guys (Smith, Roberts, Hanson) all have big wins over returning state placers in this bracket. A few of these guys have split head-to-heads. And as nice as the random draw was at 106, it was not at 113. The bottom half includes #2 Sheffer, #3 Bindner, defending state champion #4 Vega, and #6 Smith. This is a quarterfinal and semifinal weight you don't want to miss. Match of the opening round, bout #23 puts #5 Jason Hall against #7 Joey Scaggs; two guys that some expected to challenge for a title this season (one is going to the consolation round early).

Erdman is very dangerous and his match with Poynter in the semis should be a great one (probably the hardest pick I had of all the brackets).

Blackwell is favored to take home his second title with multiple wins over #2 ranked Austin. Explosives on day 1 will be Austin and 8th grader Carr (ranked #3) in round 2. Along with Carr there is a lot of young talent here (Duncan, Emerson, Johnson, Lopez, Torgenson, Spahr, Miles) who will challenge for spots on the podium. Spahr has the potential to wrestle above this slot if he is 100% healthy and challenge for a medal. With so many young wrestlers at this weight anything can happen, but it will be tough for guys outside the top 10 to challenge for a medal as most of these kids are battle tested.

Yes, he is finally done. Brock is all set to become the first win #5 and help his team win a title while he is at it. We didn't really see a mass exodus of this weight as many probably expected. That is partially because Ervin wrestled both 132 and 138 this season, but also because we have some pretty tough kids both above and below this weight as well. A big surprise this season is #3 ranked Ashford who beat Erdman and Maggard to win a region title and put him in line for a spot with Ervin in the finals. We will see #1 Ervin v. #2 Heidorf in the quarters.

Huge team title implications here with Heidorf, Maggard, Korfhage, and Mitchell all battling for spots on the podium. Their order of finish could he huge in the final tally.

Brown has been on the cusp of winning a title for years, but fell short. Now as a senior he is poised to win a state championship. But he will face a few tough challenges with multiple previous state placers and a state champion (Whalen). A couple of very good quarterfinal matches here with #6 Andreoni v. #2 Whalen and #3 Kahl v. #4 Matlock. The semis here could be some of the best of the day. This is a senior dominated weight class, but Andreoni is a tough, tough freshman who can compete with anyone.

Although I will say Young will have to earn his championship potentially having to beat #2 Lawson, #3 Daugherty, and #4 Johnson (in the quarters) along the way.

An interesting kid to follow will be Brown. Not sure how he fell to 4th in the region, but that is a bad draw for almost any region champ. He could score some unexpected points or nothing at all coming in as a 4. Sinclair can also be a wild card for Campbell to have a shot at staying ahead of St X and chasing Union.
