# 2018 Ranger Report Kentucky High School State Wrestling Championship Preview

Yes, it's the end of another hard fought KY high school wrestling season, but it is one that is unlike any other for Dutch and I anyway. Seasons come and seasons go, but we will be watching our boys compete in the Alltech Arena for the last time. I realize that many, many of you have been in our shoes over the previous years and even decades. Now we know exactly how you feel. Sad-exciting times all rolled up in one. Luckily for me, I have another one coming through to delay my total depression. Not looking forward to revisiting this in 4 years.

What a great group of seniors. I am a little biased given all of the hours of training I've spent with these young men from all over the state and miles we have traveled across the country to compete together. When I think back to some of our glory days with MS Team Ky (Bender, Tucker, Moore, Roth, Johnson, Smallwood, Smith, Leavell, along with a ton of others including younger guys as well) it has been a fun ride. These guys were not always super studs, but have used hard work and effort to improve and develop into some of the best in our state.

So, back to the wrestling. Four months ago we kicked off the season with the third All Star Classic. As usual a great day of wrestling. Awesome to see kids from all over the state show up to participate and to see a little freestyle action with the young guns. This season has seen some new kids emerge as stars in our sport, but we have also seen a lot of familiar faces continue their winning ways. On a negative note, we have seen a lot of injuries impact a lot of kids and teams. We were blessed to see a few big names make their way back on the mat (Mason Smith, Zane Brown, Jake Insko to name a few), but unfortunately many others will not be wrestling this weekend due to serious injuries derailing their year. Again, enjoy and appreciate your time at state. Don't take it for granted.

This time of year always brings up the seeding discussion. Following is a repost of last year's report.

The following was taken from TheMat.com regarding seeding:

### Why Seeding Matters

Every year, there is a lot of confusion as to how conference tournaments and NCAAs are seeded. Many coaches and athletes will tell you, "seeds don't matter" because what happens on the mat determines who advances, and to win it all you need to beat whoever's in your path. But in reality, seeds (and also rankings throughout the season in general) matter A LOT for at least four important reasons:

1. Because fans are entertained so much by rankings, they are automatically critical to the sport. Rankings and seeding (which is just a subset of rankings) are instrumental to drawing fan interest to any sport. I'd go as far as to say no other topic is debated more consistently and with as much fervor by fans as seeding/rankings--and this is for most major sports, not just wrestling. Rankings and in particular seeding make it easier for the average fan to follow the sport, are often used as the basis for making predictions (which is the thing fans most like to do), and are a key input for bookmakers setting betting odds.

2. Rankings give major media outlets a general sense of which matches and athletes to cover to maximize fan interest.

Conference tournaments and NCAAs are among the hardest sporting events of any kind for media to follow. While it's nice that ESPN now covers the entire NCAA tournament online, a tiny percentage of fans see even 1/4 of that action. How the fan base broadly perceives the events is defined first and foremost by how the media covers these events.

3. Seeds provide an important incentive for teams and athletes to excel during the regular season. Admittedly, this can be a double-edged sword, since every year, several coaches make line-up decisions by giving at least partial consideration to how rankings/seeding will be impacted, which can lead to "seed protection." But more often, there is a strong incentive to wrestle so as to build a body of work to maximize your chances for a high seed.

### 4. Not everyone is Logan Stieber or Alex Dieringer.

The notion of an "easier path" to the finals absolutely exists in reality. Not all the time, not for every weight, but to think otherwise is foolish. Not having to wrestle a pigtail, getting a bye, wrestling weaker guys to start the tournament with an easier early match (particularly important for the big weight cutters), being on the opposite side of the guys who are bad match-ups, etc. all matter. Also, not everyone's goal is to be an NCAA champion. I know Gable would skewer me for saying this, but there are LOTS of wrestlers who would absolutely "sign on the dotted line" for an 8th place finish before nationals. I certainly would've back in the day.

### A couple interesting items we should watch out for this weekend:

 Without any 4-timer type wrestlers in the field, do we have a MOW frontrunner or will that award truly come down to who performs best at the Horse Park? Or will Saul get the nod if he is able to win his 3rd title?
 REPEAT: Who will win 120? Again, possibly the deepest weight class in the tournament from 1-14 with a state champ, state finalists, and multiple placers should have the crowd's attention from the opening round.
 REPEAT with a slight variation: Who will step up to win a wide open 195 weight class?
 REPEAT: Can anyone hang with Union County? Broken record. They proved they were the best dual team in the state 2 weeks ago at Lindsey Wilson and this weekend they are the obvious favorites. Can Walton or X beat them? Or can a wild card like Madison Central or Woodford Co jump up and push them?
 The KYWCA made some awesome upgrades for the wrestlers last year. Hopefully, we can continue to work together and move this event and our sport forward for the benefit of all the hard working kids around Kentucky.

Final rankings were posted previously. This document is predicted finishes based on the final rankings and the draw. The winner of each matchup in the bracket is based on rankings, not any sort of prediction as to who we think will win. As usual, I'm sure we missed our fair share of results (some coaches are really, really bad at keeping track up to date), so they are not perfect. They also do not reflect any scratches that have come in the last day or so (I literally just heard from a coach about an update 15 minutes ago). And even IF they were perfect rankings, upsets always happen on the big stage.

As always, Dutch and I have put in hours and hours on rankings and this report. Thanks to Stacy for not meeting me at the door with a gun over the last few very late nights and Amber for actually letting me back in the house at 3 am night after night. It is impossible to pull all of this information together alone. And Dutch has been a huge part of getting this great report out.

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Jayssen Hanson - looked great at State Duals beating 4 state qualifiers

Team title race implications: Peace and Hanson hit in the quarters with the winner guaranteed a podium spot and a big edge in the team race. Kinley is a key component for Madison Central making a run toward a team trophy; placing top 4 is a must. Andreoni is projected to make it to the blood round while Moore is expected to win a couple matches for Union County. Another win or two could be huge team points for these guys.

The 106 weight class doesn't have the proven HS wrestlers of years past, but that doesn't mean it lacks talent. Five wrestlers in this bracket are previous MS state champions along with multiple other MS state placers. So these kids know what it is like to compete at a state level event, but how will that translate for their first HS state competition in The Barn (aka AllTech Arena). Grandstaff is undefeated at this weight and won a tough Region 6 tournament, which included #2 Peace and #4 Thomas, in dominant fashion.

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Austin Gibson - has a decent draw and the potential to pull off an upset or two and finish on the podium

Team title race implications: Deck has been completely dominant most of the season and could score huge bonus points for Madison Central here. Bender has been a contender most of his HS career, but has a few more losses than in years past leading to his lower ranking heading into this post season. Woodford County needs him to show up with his bonus point potential to make a run at the top 3. Ohlmann is projected to finish just off the podium, but has the potential to score some surprise points for St X. Walton doesn't have as many bullets in the chamber as Union and X, but this little guy could score very important points in their chase for a top team finish. Maybe he will crack 88 on the scale this weekend and pull out a few wins.

Where 106 had no returning state placers, 113 is stacked with 5 returning placers. Deck is the odds-on favorite and would be ranked #1 at 120 had he stayed there with a win over Wallace. Miller also dropped down from 120 and looks to be favored to make a return trip to the finals at this weight. Horton and Pye had a battle in the region finals and hope to spoil the plans of the top 2. But Horton has a big match in the quarters with Bender who he beat at the Raider Rumble.

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Isaac Pledger - St Xavier always comes to the Horse Park ready to perform and the older Pledger could be one to step up and score major extra points for the team

Team title race implications: Adams is set to score big points for Union as the favorite, but should face a stiff challenge to score bonus points as he has a bear of a draw. His potential path to the finals includes #6 Storck, #3 Mattingly, and #5 Cowan. Preston is another Woodford wrestler projected to finish just outside the placement round, but could surprise us and give the team a boost. For St X, Pledger here with a chance to shine and push the team toward a championship.

This was a highly debated weight class back to early November with some bold predictions. And I quote:

I'll go on and predict the finals at 120 will be Storck and Cagen Wallace, another fine young man whose father I actually like. If I'm wrong, I'll eat my crow. If it comes to fruition it'll be a hell of a match not to mention a real matchup."

"Storck will wrestle at 120 this season. Sorry to shake up the rankings again! But whoa 7th at 126??? Pretty sure he's beaten the majority of those kids ranked above him there if not all of them. But hey, you have your agenda! Watch for him in the finals at State. And thank you for your hard work! Let the comments begin haha"

All of the teams chasing Union County are hoping your prediction becomes a reality. This weight should have fireworks from the opening matches. Defending state champ Wallace came in as the heavy favorite, but has taken a couple losses and seen Adams and Mattingly emerge as serious challengers. Can the Lindsey Wilson recruit win the deepest weight and go out a 2-time state champion? Mattingly was a state runner-up last year and comes in undefeated. Must see match if he meets Adams in the quarters (bout 570).

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Jake Insko - the mystery at this weight missing much of the season due to injury, Jake could make the finals if he is healthy and ready to roll

Team title race implications: Woodford's first big point scorer as Tucker is the clear favorite. The big question is will the Bacon sizzle in Lexington? Union is counting on his top 2 points. Pledger has a good shot to make the podium and pick up valuable team points for St X.

Tucker has battled injuries for much of his HS career. He missed his sophomore post season due to a knee injury and was unable to compete for the state title he was favored to win. Last year he came back late in the season and battled his way to a 3rd place finish in a tough 126 bracket. Is this his year to finally get his title? Bacon will be tested early by another wrestler returning from injury in Jake Insko. This quarterfinal match could set the tone for how this bracket will play out.
