Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Aiden Zinser has been tough since making the drop to 106 and has a favorable draw to make a deep run

Team title race implications: The only weight with no Union County representative. If Williams can make a deep run to the finals that will be big points for Johnson Central in what will be a tight battle for 2nd. Christian County will score here as well with Campbell, but not sure where. Ryle could make a push for the top 3 if Messerly makes that finals run.

106 is always a fun weight class to follow. We always have a few hammers at this weight and a bunch of kids looking to make a name for themselves. At 43-0 Moore is ranked #4 in the country by Flowrestling and comes to the horse park as the prohibitive favorite, but the top heavy bracket will likley put him against #3 Reeves in the quarters and #2 Tucker in the semis before he gets another shot at that state title that eluded him last year. Tucker only has 1 loss on the season (out of state) and will be heavily favored to make the semis. Reeves is undefeated with a win over Messerly, but has a tough road. I see the bottom side of this bracket as wide open. Brown has been solid this year, but with #4 through #10 on the bottom anything could happen. As I mention above, I think that Zinser-Williams match in round 2 will be huge for day 2.

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Joey Sander has been battle tested with that Ryle schedule and has passed many of those tests. He has a brutal draw, but he will be a very tough out

Team title race implications: Big points for the top 2 teams here with Eckman and Fowler. Just like 106 Ryle has a chance to make up ground on Johnson Central and Christian County if Sander steps up big. Meek does have a draw that could allow him to score some crucial points for JC.

113 has 6 returning state placers in the bracket; 3 of them are in the bottom quarter. Eckman could face a state placer in round 2 (Sallee), quarters (Meyer), and the final (Fowler). But similar to Sander and Ryle, Union County is battle tested and Eckman has been rock solid all year. Gilbert comes into state at 25-0 and has to go through a state placer in round 2 as well in Johnson. #2 Fowler doesn't have a state placer in round 2, just 31-2 Menchaca. This weight should be exciting starting on Friday afternoon.

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Nolan Banfield placed at 106 and although the bracket doesn't favor him, I think he will find his way onto the podium

Team title race implications: Thomas has scored a lot of bonus points this season and Ryle will need them to keep pace with the top 3. Lawson will represent big points for Johnson Central at 120 as Christian County does not have a wrestler here.

This is one of the most balanced brackets in the event; half of the top 10 on the top, half on the bottom. Returning state champion Thomas is a solid favorite here and looking to keep on pace to win 4 titles. He should be able to put up some bonus points on the top half of the bracket. On the bottom you have returning state runner-up from 113 Thornton and returning 3rd from 113 Lawson. These two didn't meet last year, so I'm looking forward to this showdown. We don't see a lot of Johnson Central during the season, but Thornton had a huge win over #1 at 126 Kinley, so I will favor him to come out of the lower half of the bracket and face Thomas.

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Gus Roberts seems to be the pick here, but to be honest, this weight has been total chaos all season and absolutely anything is possible at this weight

Team title race implications: Can Webb find his way to the podium? Or will Wells be the only contending team with a kid on the podium at this weight? Smith may be a sleeper for Ryle in a weight class that has been anything but predictable all season.

Chaos. That's all I can say about this weight. While the top 8-9 has been relatively stable, with only a shuffling of the order, 10-25 has been absolute pandomonium this year. At one point I just didn't update this weight class with the rankings update because it made my head hurt. Hoppes and Kinley have spent most of the season as the top dogs, but Herron and Fuji can definitely upset that apple cart. Walls could also put himself in that conversation. Heck, what am I talking about. This is 126 in 2020. Put all 32 names in a hat and draw one out. There's your winner. Ha ha. Not quite that crazy, but close.

Kid who might out wrestle their ranking: Luke Chapman was my pick last year at 106 and he came through big, so why not this year. Moving up 4 weight classes is tough and he has been a bit up and down this season, but this is not a wrestler to overlook.

Team title race implications: Adams, Andreoni, and Cain all have high podium potential. IF Deck is not 100% and one of these guys is able to take advantage it could push their team to another level.

This has been a weight with a big unknown all season. 2-time champ Deck had off season surgery and many of us didn't think he would be back for the season, but a superman recovery had him back on the mat by the Christmas holiday. Then a very late season setback had virtually everyone doubting his participation in the post season. And here we are, a day out from the state tournament and Thomas Deck is the favorite to win a third title. Hopefully he is healthy and ready to roll. But if not, there are a host of kids ready to step up and earn that title. Seniors Adams and Lutes have been near the top for the last couple years and look to finish on that top step. After the top 4, this weight is filled with a lot of tough wrestlers who have yet to completely prove themselves at state.

This is another bracket where the draw was not kind to some with #1, #2, #4, #5 all on the top. That puts Lutes on the bottom with a couple ranked young guys.

Team title race implications: This is a spot where Woodford must have big points from Yost. He sits at the top of the bracket with no other top 5 kids. Grant-Hall has a brutal draw with Stacey first round. How he, Craddock, and Giompalo battle through consolations could impact who takes home a trophy.

After a year of regression to the mean, 138 is back to the top of the meatgrinder list. Yost comes in undefeated, top ranked, and hoping to bookend his career with state titles. But he will be challenged by a host of hammers with state title dreams of their own. That list includes prior state champion Grandstaff who is 1 match short of going for his third title in 3 years. Also challenging for the top spot on the podium will be another senior Jake Insko who transferred to Union County this year and Zac Cowan who has battled both seniors in multiple matches this season. A major wild card in the equation is 8th grader Malachi Rider. The #2 ranked youngster has a win over Insko this year, but in a weird twist of events lost in the semis on an illegal slam and then forfeitted to 4th. As a result, he will hit Grandstaff in round 1. OUCH! Those boys better get off the bus ready to roll on Friday.

Consolations will be a circus at this weight. Don't miss that action.

So mixing the killer quarter up top and an upset and the consolations could get interesting and possibly impact those team scores.

If I were going to only catch the quarterfinals of one weight this would be my choice.

Russelburg was the surprise of the tournament for most of us last year; he caught fire and won a very good 152 bracket last February. He is no longer that skinny kid from Union County (I think he ate well and hit the weights in the off season) and will be tough to keep from repeating. But Lawrence and Brooks are both very experienced and dangerous wrestlers. And the X-factor here is Tom KC who had knee surgery and did not compete at all this season until regionals. Where is he? Close to 100%? Maybe he is fresh and will be even better. That matchup could happen in the quarters, so Russelburg has a tough road to earn his second title.

Not only is Union County entering the state tournament as the favorite to win their 5th team state championship in a row, but they are also likely to break the 2003 South Oldham scoring record of 257.5 points. My current projection is 265.5, so I give them a good shot to do it, but we all know anything can happen at state. While I expect the race for the top spot to possibly be over (or at least close to locked) by the time we head to the hotel Friday night, I think the battle between Christian County and Johnson Central will go right down to the championship finals. I also think the battle for the final overall team trophy between Woodford County, Ryle, Walton Verona, and Madison Central will be tight as well. Madison Central has been the poster child team for injuries. They should still compete for a fairly high placement, but they have lost a lot of potential this year due to injury.
